Origin & Vinification

Ried SCHRECK (scare) is a steep slope terraced vineyard in the back of the historical city Stein. The old vines root deep in meagre, blue schist "plates", supported by typical stone terrace walls. SCHRECK is southern exposed and faces the famous Frauenbergkirche of Stein.

Its name is originated in the middle ages. Grape thieves could not be seen between the vines because of dense vine planting. During harvest time, tower guards had to keep the thieves from stealing grapes by shouting spontaneously. These were scared and disappeared.

The grapes of Ried SCHRECK were harvested on the 18th of October 2017 by hand. After destemming and crushing, the berries were skin-macerated for 9 hours and then pressed gently. After the fermentation in stainless steel tanks, the wine was matured on the lees until July 2018.

Wine description

94 pts. FALSTAFF

Bright yellow-green, silver reflexes. Fine tropical fruits, ripe peach, tender hints of fresh orange zest, dense, fine nuances of pomaceous fruit, mineral and persistent, long finish with very good aging potential.
